The International Day of Peace was established by the United Nation as the day of worldwide ceasefire and non-violence. The **Hawaii Federation of Jr. YBA** lobbied the legislature to set aside a Peace Day in Hawaii. State Representative Jon Riki Karamatsu introduced a bill on behalf of the Hawaii Federation of Jr. YBA. Governor Linda Lingle signed the bill into law on April 17, 2007. Peace Day in Hawaii coincides with the International Day of Peace on September 21.

TAP ON OUR SHOULDERS

...the power of great compassion saturates all life. That power flows through my very own life though, I do not often acknowledge it, ever so deeply, gratefully... The power of great compassion - Na-Mo-A-Mi-Da-Bu - saturates all existence without exception. The flow of great compassion is timeless and formless, with no beginning nor ending.

...The Six Characters of the formless Buddha are without limit yet, arising at the very, moment, in the deepest part of our hearts and minds, touching us, preparing me for this moment, round and round, from imperfect life to this imperfect life, from deepest life to deepest life, from each moment of truth to each moment of truth. Life has flowed into the present, here and now.

... To live and to be made to truly come alive, joyfully, grateful in Life and Light without limit in the timeless, formless Na-Mo-A-Mi-Da-Bu, NaManDaBu, there are no bounds to the joy and gratitude all beings in the ten directions share. Na-Mo-A-Mi-Da-Bu...

Hello dear members and friends, brothers and sisters of the Dharma. I hope you are well and safe in the amazing power of great compassion flowing through our lives together.

The 2017 Obon season has all but, been completed through the months of June, July and August. Our KHBT Taiko Group and assisting volunteers scurrying near and far to host community and temples' Obon Dances are an intense time of the year for everyone involved.

The Autumn Higan will be upon us - for us to contemplate the balance of life seasons in Dharma. To the Obon committee, the Shinwakai, the Taiko Group, and so many volunteers, youth and elders alike - thank you kindly from the Kona Hongwanji Buddhist Temple community for a beautiful and highly successful Obon Season - Arigatou Gozaimasu.

On July 15th, Saturday, the head priest of Nepal's Kathmandu Hongwanji Buddhist Temple - the Reverend Sonam Wangdi Bhutia spent his precious time as our Hawaii island district's HHMH Buddhist Study Center Summer Session Satellite guest speaker at Kona Hongwanji.

Sonam at the age of three was ordained as a Tibetan novice monk. All his young life, he was immersed in Buddhist studies, monastic disciplines and meditations, preparing his own spiritual journey to enlightenment. Though he could not speak on-behalf of fellow-monks, by the time a young adult, he confessed to a deepening frustration that could not rid himself of the three basic poisons: greed, anger and ignorance or foolish stupidity that muddy the waters of Buddhist wisdom to enlightenment.

By the age of 25, Sonam had made pilgrimages to Bodhgaya, India and for three years, three months, three weeks, three days and three hours immersed himself in Buddhist meditation. One day, he came upon a Japanese Buddhist lay by the name of Hiromichi Mukaibo who came to the site of Sakyamuni Buddha's enlightenment to pay homage to his spiritual inspiration.

The high priest, Sonam, Bhutia inquired as to the reason Mr. Mukaibo came to the Bodhgaya site: Was it to pray for a miracle that would free Mukaibo from his wheelchair? Hiromichi was completely paralyzed from his neck-down due to a horrible car accident plunging him down a cliff-side in his youthful indiscretion. Hiromichi responded, "No, I did not come to this sacred site to pray for any spiritual miracles-

I am actually here to praise the amazing virtues of the Buddha's Great Compassion, Na-Mo-A-Mi-Da-Bu enabling me to live a creative and beautiful life. If not for this life-changing accident crippling the rest of my body, I would not have been changed into a human being of deep gratitude and happiness to the Buddha's power, the Vow, that transformed my confused and broken life..."

High priest, Sonam would henceforth, return to his spiritual friend and guide - Zenjishiki Mr. Mukaibo who led him to the Buddha's Great Compassion again and again into the wondrous power of the ONembutsu.*

***For much of Hiromichi Mukaibo's life, his mother took him to various shrines and temples in Japan to pray for miracles that would make him walk again from his life bound to a wheelchair.**

In his deepest heart and mind, the Reverend Sonam Wangdi Bhutia, came to experience the thunderous roar of the Buddha's Vow and Name - Na-Mo-A-Mi-Da-Bu. Sonam was transformed in the VOW of the NEMBUTSU. He was subsequently emboldened to proclaim its power to his dharma brother and sisters throughout Nepal's community and various parts of the world wherever invited!

On July 11, 2017, my own mother - Asako Nakamura - fulfilled her 86 years of human life. She had been subject to the dimming effects of dementia for over 17 years. With her husband, our father - Ichiro - by her side and our four sisters - particularly, neesan - Lorna watched and took wonderful care of both of them, despite painful and confusing moments at various times.

Married for over 64 years to her husband, Ichiro, mom truly and deeply loved her husband, no matter how difficult it was at times for Asako. I being the second son, mostly lived away after high school, going into the Navy for five years and living off-island from my parents up to the present serving in the Hongwanji Buddhist ministry.

After 17 years plus and three stints with Hilo Hongwanji, I have come to realize that there was no way I could fathom the love of my mother and father for all their six children, let alone the Buddha's Great Compassion for me and all beings in the ten directions.

It seems only upon mom's death, after 17+ years of dementia dimming her life, was I made to be acutely aware of our families' tenacious strength to endure, that we as children have come to experience in some real and deeper sense of how mom and dad will always love and guide us - no matter how imperfect our family is on a basic human level.

As I could not imagine my mom's life without my dad's, nor could I my own, without my brother and sisters, it's just as impossible to fathom true and deep life without the amazing power and happiness of the Buddha's great compassion - NaManDaBu. Up until that very final moment of human breath from my mom, neesan-Lorna accompanied her in love, patience and the Nembutsu. And with that simple, yet profound praise in mama's heart, 'NaManDaBu, NaManDaBu, NaManDaBu...', she returned home naturally in the Buddha's great calling and embrace.

In our imperfect and limited human life, what really matters should be guided by what's most vital and essential, like a tap on our shoulders, the Power of Great Compassion call attention to our deepest Heart of hearts. Blossoming forth into gracious Life and Light with no end, we naturally return to the our true source of Life and Light. Na-Mo-A- Mi-Da-Bu...

HEADQUARTER'S UPDATE

HIS EMINENCE MONSHU KOJUN OHTANI'S OFFICIAL VISIT TO HONPA HONGWANJI MISSION OF HAWAII

It is truly a privilege and great honor for us that His Eminence Monshu Kojun Ohtani and his entourage will be visiting Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii in September 2017.

On June 6, 2014, His Eminence Monshu Kojun Ohtani came to inherit the legacy of the Jodo Shinshu through receiving the transmission from the Monshu Emeritus Koshin Ohtani, succeeding to the posts of the resident priest of Hongwanji and the Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha Monshu. Following his succession, Gomonsu Kojun Ohtani traveled across Japan, making an official visit to each district to directly exchange greetings and converse with ministers and lay delegates of affiliated temples.

From October 2016-May 2017, Gomonsu Kojun Ohtani successfully conducted a series of 80 services called Dento Hokoku Hoyo (The Commemoration on the Accession of the Jodo Shinshu Tradition) at the Hongwanji main temple in Kyoto. Two formal delegations from Hawaii attended the Dento Hokoku Hoyo, and the Gomonsu Kojun Ohtani kindly took the time and held a special audience for those delegates.

Gomonsu Kojun Ohtani is scheduled to visit Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii and its temples. Please contact your temple minister or temple office for more details of this special visit.
