HEADQUARTER'S UPDATE

MINISTERIAL ASSIGNMENTS (JINJI)

REVEREND BERT SUMIKAWA, the Resident Minister of Moiliili Hongwanji Mission, will retire from active ministry as of January 31, 2018. Rev. Sumikawa served HHMH as a Kaikyoshi-ho Minister from December 2007 to March 2011, and as a Kaikyoshi Minister from April 2011.

Rev. Sumikawa will be assigned to be the minister in charge of Kailua Hongwanji Mission, as well as the Chaplain of the Pacific Buddhist Academy. Both Assignments as a Retired Kaikyoshi Minister will begin as of March 1, 2018.

REVEREND TOSHIYUKI UMITANI, the Executive Assistant to the Bishop, will oversee Moiliili Hongwanji Mission from February 15, 2018 until May 31, 2018 while he continues his duties as the Executive Assistant to the Bishop. MY SISTER'S EQUAL

A Japan-person must study a life-time writing, understanding, trying to master KANJI - the Japanese reading of Chinese writing. The challenge is just too many Chinese characters even with new Japanese terms up to the present. Life's pathway similarly - the more we learn,

study, understand and try to master, the deeper we realize how limited and fragile our abilities really are. Until the day we die, if we remain open to learning and growing,- recipients to the boundless Ocean of Great Compassion, in spite of our deep-seated tendency to greed, anger and stupidity (G.A.S.).

I was recently introduced to an English term I wasn't familiar until I read of its use: misogyny or misogynist -one who has or shows distrust, intolerance and hate for women. The abuse, harassment and improper exploitation of women in the work-place in a recent MSNBC poll showed one out of every three. Of course, this poll is largely under-reported as the actual numbers are much, higher.

Misogynistic attitudes and behavior primarily rear its ugly head because men have grown-up being taught that by-in-large, women are not their equals and can be used as objects, namely, sex objects. Targeting women (no matter the age) to feed a man's sexual urges involves power and its abuse whether, it's at home, in the workplace and any where there are opportunities for men and women) to interact in situations or places where abuse of authority and power go unchecked. In a rare but, extreme case of abuse and murder of a Bikuni - a female nun Renge, formerly a courtesan, she was converted under the guidance of Maudgalyayana and attained the highest enlightenment. Becoming head of a nunnery, the account goes that Devadatta (cousin to Siddhartha) beat her to death after she admonished him for his evil ways. p.313. 1

Except for very rare cases, this basic and ongoing issue comes from a male-dominated (patriarchal) culture or society found throughout the entire world. In historical Buddhism and subsequently, scriptural writings are found "its implications for women's aspiration for rebirth as a man who can then, cultivate monkish practices for *Buddhahood*":

(35th Vow: If, upon my obtaining of Buddhahood, women in all the immeasurable and inconceivable Buddha-worlds in the ten quarters should not, after hearing my Name, be filled with joy and trust and awaken their thoughts to enlightenment and loathe their femininity, and if in another birth they should again assume the female body, may I not attain the Highest Enlightenment." 2

This Vow mirrors the social norm, the given reality that women had neither the inherent potential nor the spiritual capacity as subordinates in their roles and place in family, culture and society for any possibility of enlightenment.

In India spiritual practice and education were considered strictly a male pursuit and responsibility. Women grew up were taught never be independent or autonomous or they be marked as "loose women". Even "loose women" notably, prostitutes had their place in society by being official wards of the male-run district, township or village where they offered their services.

The historical Buddha *Sakyamuni* clothed his Sangha of monks and nuns with the spiritual authority and respect to meet India's societal standards in which he and his community lived. The Buddha's strategy symbolized an ideal community - a place to take refuge in the three jewels that essentially gave the same opportunities of spiritual practice based on the same equality for women, just as for men.

In retrospect living in modern society, we now know and have been subject to the imprint and impact of larger cultures and societies anchored by male-dominated ideas and practices. Such practices having discriminated against women, other races and marginalize groups have not kept pace with *Sakyamuni* Buddha's spiritual ideals as practice.

The *Theravada Palimokkha* master-list or rules shows 227 precepts for monks and 311 for nuns. **3** At first glance this seems discriminatory against female nuns. However, at a closer look, while differing in number, they are also complementary with the primary intent to protect the vulnerability of nuns in potentially male- controlled situations. The actual number of rules grew to 311 originating from nuns primarily concerned about the behavior of novice nuns.

For the nuns, seemingly, the precepts reflect greater regulation and stricture because women tend to be more vulnerable and subject to male aggression, power and authority.

We certainly know that the Buddha and his disciples knew that the women or nuns were the very ones who became pregnant and required to care and nurture the child. While the social and historical outcomes show that the lay support wavered at first with nuns, the Sangha's reputation had a slight set-back having to weather India's social norms. The long-term effect however, was that the universal practice of compassion toward all beings aroused in the life and teachings of *Sakyamuni Gotama Buddha* resonated as a living practice for all who aspired to embody and practice the equality of all beings.

For those of us brought up in a family, community and society that's learned to disrespect, devalue and exploit others, in particular women, the pathway is long and arduous. There must always be the open heart and perseverance to unlearn deeply, once and for all, just as much deeply, turning about to awaken to the Dharma of Light and Life that liberates us from the mind of discrimination. *Na Mo A Mi Da Buddha...*
