FALSEHOOD REPEATED OVER AND OVER BECOMES TRUTH

Once in a jungle forest, a rabbit dozed quietly under a coconut tree. As he began to wake from his slumber, a huge coconut suddenly fell on the ground exploding next to him. Jolted awake, the rabbit screamed, "The earth is exploding! The earth is exploding!" as he ran about screaming.

Soon other rabbits joined him scampering about, screaming, "The earth is exploding!" Startled deer heard the cries of the rabbits and joined in their flight. They were soon followed by a boar, an elk, a buffalo, an ox, a rhinoceros, a tiger and an elephant. The lion king heard their shouts and decided to investigate. "The earth is not exploding. This certainly is a mistake. If I don't do something, all the animals will run into the large river and drown!"

The lion king ran in front of the stampeding animals and roared, "STOP! Who told you the earth is exploding?" The boar said, "Why the rabbit said!" The buffalo said, "The elk said!" The rhinoceros said, "The ox said!" The elephant said, "The tiger said the earth is exploding!"

Is it really true the earth is exploding?" asked the lion king. "Oh yes, great lion king, it is," said the first rabbit. "Then..." said the lion king, "you and I are going back to the place where the earth first exploded to see for ourselves if it's true or not!"

With the frightened rabbit holding tightly on to the lion king's back, the lion raced back to the place where the rabbit first lay dozing under the coconut tree. The lion king saw the shattered coconut on the ground and said to the rabbit, "You silly rabbit! The sound of a coconut exploding as it hits the ground does not mean that the earth is exploding!" And they ran back to the other animals to explain the mistake. The Dharma morale of this Jataka tale - The Lion King: **WHEN A FALSEHOOD IS REPEATED TEN TIMES OVER, IT BECOMES TRUE!**

In Hawaii, as recently as mid-January, we all experienced the horrible apprehension, that just moments away, a nuclear missile would strike somewhere over our islands' state. A photograph appeared first thing the next morning in the newspaper showing a hysterical crowd running to where? as did the animals in "A Jataka tale -The Lion King."

The horrible irony of the nuclear bombs dropped over the populations of Hiroshima and Nagasaki forcing Japan to surrender was that instead of our post-WWII world declaring that hence forth, nuclear bombs would never make its presence known on the earth again, we went the opposite directions. Many nations now have nuclear arsenals that can obliterate the entire world thousands of times over. This conclusion stems from an arrogantly, simple yet, profound falsehood - the more nuclear bombs we have, the safer we'll be... We have repeated this lie again, over and over so often that, we no longer know what is true anymore.

Instead we share a reality, of being complicit to perhaps the most horrible and profound evil our modern world may come to experience - nuclear annihilation. We are left unaware of what we are capable of doing in the next moment in order to sustain our lives, so passion-bound to this existence.

Yuien recalls our Master Shinran's words:

..Among those who make their way in this world drawing nets in the seas and rivers or fishing, and those who carry on their lives hunting beasts in the moors and mountains or taking fowl, and those who pass their lives conducting trade or cultivating fields and paddies, there is no distinction. When the karmic cause within so moves us, we will do anything...

Tannisho: A Primer - 13.18.

Should we not heed our Master Shinran Shonin's words?:

...I know nothing of what is good or evil. For if I could know thoroughly, as is known in the mind of Amida, that an act was good, then I would know the meaning of "good." If I would know thoroughly, as Amida knows, that an act was evil, then I would know "evil." But for a foolish being full of blind passions, in this fleeting world - this burning house -- all matters without exception are lies and gibberish, totally without truth and sincerity. The nembutsu alone is true and real...

Tannisho Postscript 17

...If we entrust ourselves to Amida's Vow to grasp and never abandon us, even though, through the unforeseen circumstances, we commit an evil act at the very end or die without the nembutsu emerging from our lips, we will immediately realize birth into the Pure Land. Moreover, even if we do spontaneously say the Name at the point of death, it is nothing other than our expression of gratitude for Amida's benevolence, entrusting to the Buddha more and more as the time of enlightenment draws near...

Tannisho: A Primer; 14.12-13.

Will it be the matter of if the nuclear bombs will drop and where, or is it really the matter of when they will drop? The latter will trigger a world nuclear reaction of catastrophic consequences simply due to our collective arrogance asserting that 'we keep the peace' by bearing nuclear arms to kill us and each other thousands of times over.

Thus, I end this essay echoing our founder's words:

...The unfolding of enlightenment in the coming life is the essence of the Pure Land teaching of Other Power; it is the reality at work in the settlement of *shinjin*. This is the way of easy practice to be followed by those of inferior capacity, of the dharma that does not differentiate between the good and the evil.

...What more need be said? We lack both observance of precepts and wisdom, but when, by allowing ourselves to be carried on the ship of Amida's Vow, we have crossed this ocean of birth-and-death, so full of suffering, and attained the shore of the Pure Land, then the moon of awakening to things as they truly are will immediately appear, and becoming one with the unhindered light filling the ten quarters, we will benefit all sentient beings. At that moment we attain enlightenment.. Ibid., 5-7.

Thus late master said,
According to the true essence of the Pure Land way, one entrusts oneself to the Primal Vow in this life and realizes enlightenment in the Pure Land; this is the teaching I received... Ibid., 15-17.

GUIDANCE SUMMARY - NUCLEAR BALLISTIC MISSILE PREPARATIONS

1. If you are indoors, stay indoors well away from windows. Surviving the immediate effects of a nuclear blast, shock and radiation requires sheltering in resistant structures.
2. If you are outdoors, seek immediate shelter in a building preferably a concrete structure such as a commercial building or parking structure. You will only have minutes to take protective action without delay.
3. If you are driving, pull safely to the side of the road and seek shelter in a nearby building or lie flat on the ground.. There are no designated blast or fallout shelters in Hawaii.
4. **DO NOT LOOK AT THE FLASH OF LIGHT!** Light generated by the weapon will damage unprotected eyes.
5. Remain sheltered until you are told it is safe to leave or two weeks (14 days) have passed, whichever comes first. Following detonation, sheltering from the fallout for up to 14 days is critically important.
6. You may be advised that it is safe to leave your shelter for short periods of a time to locate food, water and medical care. The public may need to briefly leave their shelters to locate essential supplies.
7. Electrical, water and other utilities will be severely disrupted and unavailable. Emergency Management will assess residual radiation levels and advise when sheltering can be discontinued.
8. Listen to local AM-FM radio stations for official information and instructions.
9. Cell phone, television, radio and internet services will be severely disrupted or unavailable.
10. Schools will no conduct nuclear attack drills. Existing 'lock-down' drills serve the same purpose. Regularly conducted, these drills are more than adequate for protecting students and staff.
