Shinran Shonin was born on May 21, 1173 in Hino, an area southeast of Kyoto. His given name was Matsuwakamaru. His loss of both parents at an early age moved him to enter the Buddhist priesthood at age 9. He studied for 20 years at Mt. Hiei, home of 3,000 monasteries, enduring the most difficult of meditations and practices. At age 29, he abandoned the method of finding enlightenment by self-power (jiriki) and placed his faith in Amida's power (tariki) to realize Buddhahood. Shinran coined the term "Jodo Shinshu" meaning "The True Teachings of the Pure Land."

## **WHEN LIFE MAKES NO SENSE...**

**A heavily armed 19-year-old who had been expelled from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High school opened fire on campus just shortly before classes let out on February 10th, Wednesday, killing 17 people and terrifying students who barricaded themselves inside classrooms. Three were staff coaches-teachers; 14 were students...**

Today in the 21st century, it would be unimaginable to think that when my child goes to school in the morning, he or she won't be coming back home at school's end...and we'll never see him or her ever again in our lifetime. The suddenness of that unimaginable nightmare exploded into reality when 17 human innocence on the campus of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School were gunned down by a heavily armed young man just before classes let out...

1. *Alyssa Alhadeff, 14, was a talented soccer play and creative writer. She was remembered at a funeral service and burial in North Lauderdale, Fla., as some 400 people gathered for the service, spilling out into the street..." I wish I could have taken those bullets for Alyssa," her mother Lori said at the funeral, "I should have protected her."*
2. *Scott Beigel age, 35, was a geography teacher and the school's cross-country coach. Scott was killed after he unlocked a door enabling students in to hide from the shooter...*
3. *Martin Duque Anguiano, age 14, a freshman at school. "Words cannot describe my pain," his brother Miquel said, "I love you brother Martin - you'll be missed buddy...I love your junior! R.I.P. Martin..."*
4. *Nicholas Dworet, 17 was a senior at school with Olympic ambitions. His head-coach said the Nicholas had made huge strides in his life in the last 18 months working hard in school and in the pool. "This kid who went from the middle of the pack last year to being just lights out," head coach Baily said.*  
*...He helped put our program on the map." The Dworet family wrote in a statement, "He dreamed of making the Olympic swim team and going to the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo...He believed he could accomplish anything as long as he tried his best."*
5. *Aaron Feis, 37, the school's graduate in 1999 was an assistant football coach since 2002...He reportedly died from wounds sustained shielding students from the bullets.*
6. *Jamie Guttenberg, age 14. Father, Fred Guttenberg writes, "... Jennnifer Bloom Guttenberg and I lost our baby girl to a violent shooting at her school We lost our daughter and my son Jesse lost his sister. I am broken trying to figure out how my family is going to get through this..." At a candle-light vigil held Thursday night, he stated, "I sent (Jamie) her to school yesterday, and she was supposed to be safe," shaking back his tears, "My job is to protect my children..and I sent my kid to school..."*
7. *Chris Hixon age 49 - fatally injured after racing to the scene of the shooting trying to help the students...Hixon was the wrestling coach and athletic director...Hixon is survived by his wife and a son with special needs...*
8. *Luke Hoyer age 15 a freshman played football and was a NBA fan.' " I know Luke was quiet but, happy," cousin Grant Cox said, "and I know Luke loved his family, he had a big heart." He was the youngest of three children...*
9. *Cara Montalto, 14, loved the beach.. Aunt Lindsay Fontana posts, "We are so absolutely gutted..while your thoughts are appreciated, I beg you to do something. This should not have happened to our Cara and shouldn't happen to any other peoples' families!"*
10. *Gina Montalto was 14 - member of the school marching band winter guard...She was a smart, loving, caring articulate girl who brightened any room she entered...*
11. *Joaquin Oliver, 17, moved with his family to the United States from Venezuela when he was 3 years old...Friends told of how he played basketball in a city recreation league and loved to write poetry...*
12. *Alaina Petty, 14, was in the JROTC and helped the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints cleanup of the Florida Keys after Hurricane Irma. A statement said, "It is impossible to sum up all that Alaina was and meant to her family and friends...She was a vibrant,*

determined young woman, loved by all who knew her"...It said that another member of her church had been shot twice, but was expected to recover...

13. Meadow Pollack, 18, was a senior planning to attend Lynn University in Boca Raton, Fla., in the fall..."Everyone should know how great she was;...she was a beautiful girl, inside and out, her cousin Jake Maisner said"... More than 1,000 people attended her funeral including Gov. Rick Scott, U.S. Reps. Ted Deutch, Debbie Wasserman Schultz and Cty. Commissioner Michael Udine...  
...Meadow's father yelled in anger at the accused killer at the funeral service held at Temple K'ol Tikva in Parkland..."You killed my kid!" he told the funeral congregation; "My kid is dead' goes through my head all day and all night..I keep hearing it over and over...it's unimaginable to think I'll never see my princess again...That piece of sh\_\_ killed my kid and I wasn't able to do anything about it" her father blurted out...

14. Helena Ramsay, 17, was heading to college the next year according to her family. "My family lost an absolutely beautiful member today, due to a senseless school shooting." family relative Curtis Page said.."Helena was smart, kind-hearted and a thoughtful person. She was deeply loved and loved others even more so. Though somewhat reserved, she had a relentless motivation to her academic studies, and her soft, warm demeanor brought out the best in all who knew her...."

15. Alex Schachter, 14, played the trombone in the marching band and was a "sweetheart of a kid", who "just wanted to do well and make his parents happy" said his father...His older brother, also a student at Douglas High survived the shooting...

16. Carmen Schentrup, 16, was a standout student and in September she was named a National Merit Scholarship semi-finalist...

17. Peter Wang, 15, was in the JROTC program. His cousin, Jesse told the newspaper that Peter was in study hall when the shooting began and that he held the door open so others could escape. His family owns a Chinese restaurant and was preparing to celebrate Chinese New Year on Thursday...

By all major world religions, the above senseless acts of this young man would be deemed a mystery - part of a larger plan that God has laid out within which humankind finds it impossible to fathom or make rational sense - thus a mystery beyond man's imperfect knowledge...

From Shinran's Pure Land's point of view, speaking to Yuien-bo:...do you accept what I say?...I humbly affirmed this; whereupon [he said], To begin with, would you kill one thousand people for me?...If this is done, your birth will be settled..."...I replied, "Although these are your words, I do not think I can kill even one person..."Then why do you claim that you will not diverge from what [I,] Shinran say?...

[He continued:] By this you should realize: If everything were left up to your will [to determine], then upon my saying, 'For the sake of birth kill a thousand people,' you would immediately kill. However because you lack the karmic cause enabling you to fulfill [what I said], even with a single person, you do not inflict harm...

It is not that you do no kill because your own heart is good... Further, it may happen that a person kill a hundred or a thousand people, even though he desires not to inflict harm on anyone.

Thus were his words, speaking of our thinking that the good of our hearts is **good**, thinking the evil **evil**, and not realizing that [Amida] saves [us] by the Vow's inconceivable [working]...

**"If the karmic cause that it be so prompts us, we may commit any kind of act."... [In fact (mine),] are we not such persons, who deceitfully "show outward signs of wisdom, goodness and diligence, while inwardly, harboring falsity?"** Shinran's application of the phrase, 'karmic cause that (it) so prompts us to commit any kind of act' is telling of our spiritually, deceitful and contradictive human hearts as long as human beings exist in this world. Hence we oscillate between our notions of 'good and evil' - undependable as they are, lacking any kernel of that which is 'true and real' as the Buddha's Vow knows that which is **true and real**.

Shinran's O'Nembutsu in spiritual context is when all Buddhas and bodhisattvas praise the virtues of Amida Buddha's Vow(s) as His NAME. This Name or Great Practice is by which all sentient beings who surrendering their imperfect selves are given to the "True-Entrusting" Heart of Namo Amida Butsu. The Wisdom and Compassion of Amida Buddha subsequently flows from the dynamic heart of Great Compassion (shinjin) uttered from the lips of finite beings as joyous gratitude - in other words, Great Compassion and I are One-in-the-same- Namo Amida Butsu.

In Shin, an often ignored expression synonymous with "Namo Amida Butsu" - "Union of Amida Buddha and believer as one substance" is "**Kiho-ittai**" - the believer, totally lacking any spiritual capacity, and the Buddha's Vow, grounded in absolute truth, are of one substance. To this spiritual end, the Nembutsu said from the believer's side does not originate from him or her. Though he or she spiritually contradicts or is diametrically opposed to the wondrous activity of the Buddha's Vow, it is from the side of Amida Buddha's Vow(s) that brings union impossible from the conventional religious mind of self. Thus, for the very first time (ichinen), the spiritual union of Amida's Vow of Great

Compassion and the Entrusting Heart (shinjin) are realized in the Nembutsu of Gratitude. Namo Amida Butsu, NaManDaBu, Na Man Da Butsu...When life make no sense...
