Telling New Stories Rev. Blayne Higa

Many people these days feel stuck. Whether mentally, emotionally, or spiritually there seems to be a sense of weariness over the way life has been one continuous series of challenges over the past several years. It often seems like we have been riding the same out-of-control rollercoaster with no way of knowing if it will ever slow down. This story we have been living has conditioned us to see life in a certain way and has resulted in us responding accordingly.

Shakyamuni Buddha believed in the power of the human mind to create the world in which we live. The tales we weave about our lives guides all our thoughts, words, and actions. As such, the stories we tell about ourselves can empower or disempower our ability to act. The current story of who we are limits our ability to see opportunities and



our potential for meaningful transformation and change. In his book *Community: The Structure of Belonging*, author Peter Block suggests that change is founded upon our ability to tell new stories about ourselves. We need to have "...a conversation that we have not had before, one that has the power to create something new in the world. This insight forces us to question the value of our stories, the positions we take, our love of the past, and our way of being in the world." He affirms the Buddha's timeless and hopeful wisdom which is empowering and life-giving.

When we feel so worn down by life's challenges, we often find it difficult to envision a different world. We are stuck in a narrative rut which disempowers our ability to change. Shinran Shōnin the founder of Shin Buddhism, found himself in a spiritual doldrum from which he saw no way out. Living with the old story of who he was limited his ability to see the dynamic working of wisdom and compassion in his life. Only by shifting his perspective was he finally able to experience the embrace of Amida Buddha's compassionate Vow which radically transformed his life. Shinran shares his appreciation for this new and profoundly hopeful story of spiritual awakening in the *Hymns of the Pure Land Masters*:

My eyes being hindered by blind passions, I cannot perceive the light that grasps me;

Yet the great compassion, without tiring, Illumines me always.

Holding on so tightly to the old story defining his life kept Shinran stuck and unable to change. Only by letting go of the story of who he thought he was empowered his ability to live authentically within a new life-giving story enabled through Amida's light of wisdom and compassion.

So how does clinging to the old stories we tell about ourselves limit our ability to perceive our challenges as opportunities—of seeing the light that grasps and never abandons? How does our pride and ego keep us trapped within a life-limiting and disempowering narrative of who we think we are? Only when we surrender our old story can we transform spiritual hopelessness into an empowered life of awakening. This is the true and real life of being born in the Pure Land. Namo Amida Butsu.
