This service celebrates the birth of Shinran Shōnin (May 21, 1173-January 16, 1263) who was the founder of Shin Buddhism. His life and teachings represent one of the most significant developments in the history of Buddhism. Before then only the privileged and educated received spiritual instruction. Shinran taught that everyone was equally embraced by the Buddha's infinite light and compassion, and the truth of the Dharma and shinjin awakening are accessible to everyone without discrimination.



Gratitude for Shinran and the Pure Land Way, Part 1 Rev. Blayne Higa

2023 marks the 850th birthday of Shinran Shōnin. Born on May 21, 1173, Shinran was a revolutionary thinker who shared the liberating teaching of Amida Buddha's Compassionate Vow. However, Shinran is revered not just as a great religious teacher but as a remarkable human being who lived a life of critical self-reflection and spiritual honesty who called himself "Gutoku" (foolish, stubble-haired one). I have always marveled at his humility and self-awareness, and how profoundly relatable Shinran truly is.





It was the realization of his own limitations as a human being and how he was incapable of achieving enlightenment through his own self effort, Shinran awakened to the inconceivable working of all-inclusive wisdom and all-embracing compassion symbolized as Amida Buddha. That the heart of reality makes itself known to us as the Name, Namo Amida Butsu, which is the sound of the universe calling us home to ourselves.

Gomonshu Kojun Ohtani, the spiritual head of the Nishi Hongwanji, shares an appreciation for Shinran's understanding of the Pure Land Way in the first part of his *Gratitude for the Jōdo Shinshū Teaching*:

Namo Amida Butsu.

"Entrust yourself to me. I will liberate you just as you are."
This is the calling voice of Amida.
My blind passions are embraced in the Buddha's awakening,
So the Buddha calls to me "I will liberate you just as you are."
Gratefully responding to the Buddha's call,

I find that I am already on the path that leads to the Pure Land. And the Nembutsu flows freely from my thankful heart.

Here he captures the essence of Amida's Compassionate Vow to awaken all beings because we are trapped by our karmic bonds. And this Vow of liberation is expressed as Namo Amida Butsu which is the calling voice of Amida urging us to wake up from our spiritual slumber. Our natural response to this newfound awareness of Amida's working in our lives is our heartfelt saying of the Nembutsu in gratitude. This is a life of shinjin "the entrusting heart" which is the realization of our Buddhahood made possible through an awakening of faith.

What a remarkable way of living our ordinary everyday lives with a sense of humility, wonder, and joy? A path of gratitude which opens up a whole new world of understanding in which we realize that we do not journey alone but are embraced and supported by Infinite Life itself. How grateful we are! Namo Amida Butsu.
